

Personal Comfort Guide:

FULL TIME PARTICIPATION

| Cup, bowl, plate, (preferably plastic) | Folding Cot or Air Mattress |
| Knife, fork, spoon. | Portable cooler with ice and soft drinks |
| Dishtowel or paper towels. | Clean rags or cloths |
| Toilet soap, Face towel. | Electric fan |
| Toothpaste and brush. | Folding chair |
| Wash basin. | Set of small hand tools |
| Flashlight. | Fire extinguisher CO2 preferred but box of baking soda OK. |
| Raincoat, rubbers. | Ashtrays. Garbage disposal bag. |
| Mosquito lotion, bug bomb. | FIRST AID KIT |
| Food, Campstove, pots, pans. | Tent, ropes, poles, etc. |
| Water for drinking and washing. | Table for rigs. |

* Since the bands are divided into groups, it should be discussed with your group what items above will be needed since duplication of some items would be unnecessary.

STATION EQUIPMENT GUIDE: A complete integrated station, antenna, featuring push to talk or VOX for phone, and break-in for CW is desirable. CW station should have monitoring or a keyed tone oscillator.

CW Equipment

- Complete antenna system.
- Hand key, lead and plug.
- 2 pairs earphones, suitable loudspeaker.
- Antenna coupler.
- Reliable CW receiver.
- Reliable VFO Xmtr. Either 29.5 watts, or 149.5 as 2nd choice. (requires 50% more qso's for same score)
- TR switch, or antenna switch.

Phone Equipment

- Complete antenna system.
- Desk type microphone.
- 2 pairs earphones, suitable loudspeaker.
- Antenna coupler.
- Reliable SSB or AM receiver.
- Reliable VFO-SSB-or AM Xmtr with either 29.5 watts or 149.5 2nd choice
- TR switch or antenna switch.
- Modulation indicator for AM.

Mechanical clock; Multiple outlet cube taps; Flashlight; Ashtray; Pens; Pencils; Scratch pad of paper; Erasers; Table lamp (40 watts).

*Again many of these items will be drawn up amongst the participants of a Band group.
