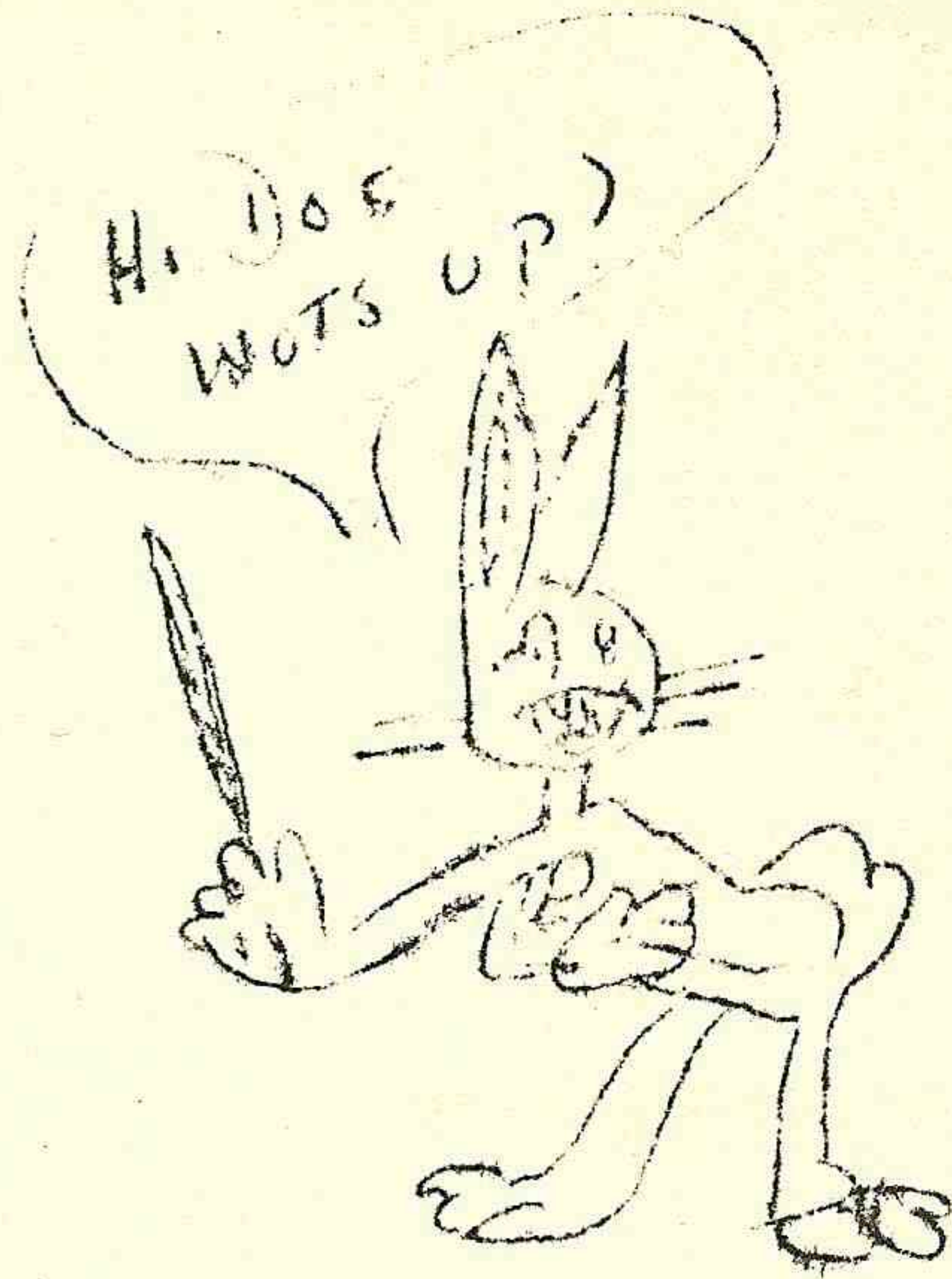

I wish to extend to the old members of the Executive our very best wishes and our profound thanks for the grand job that they accomplished in 1947. CUD DX & 73.

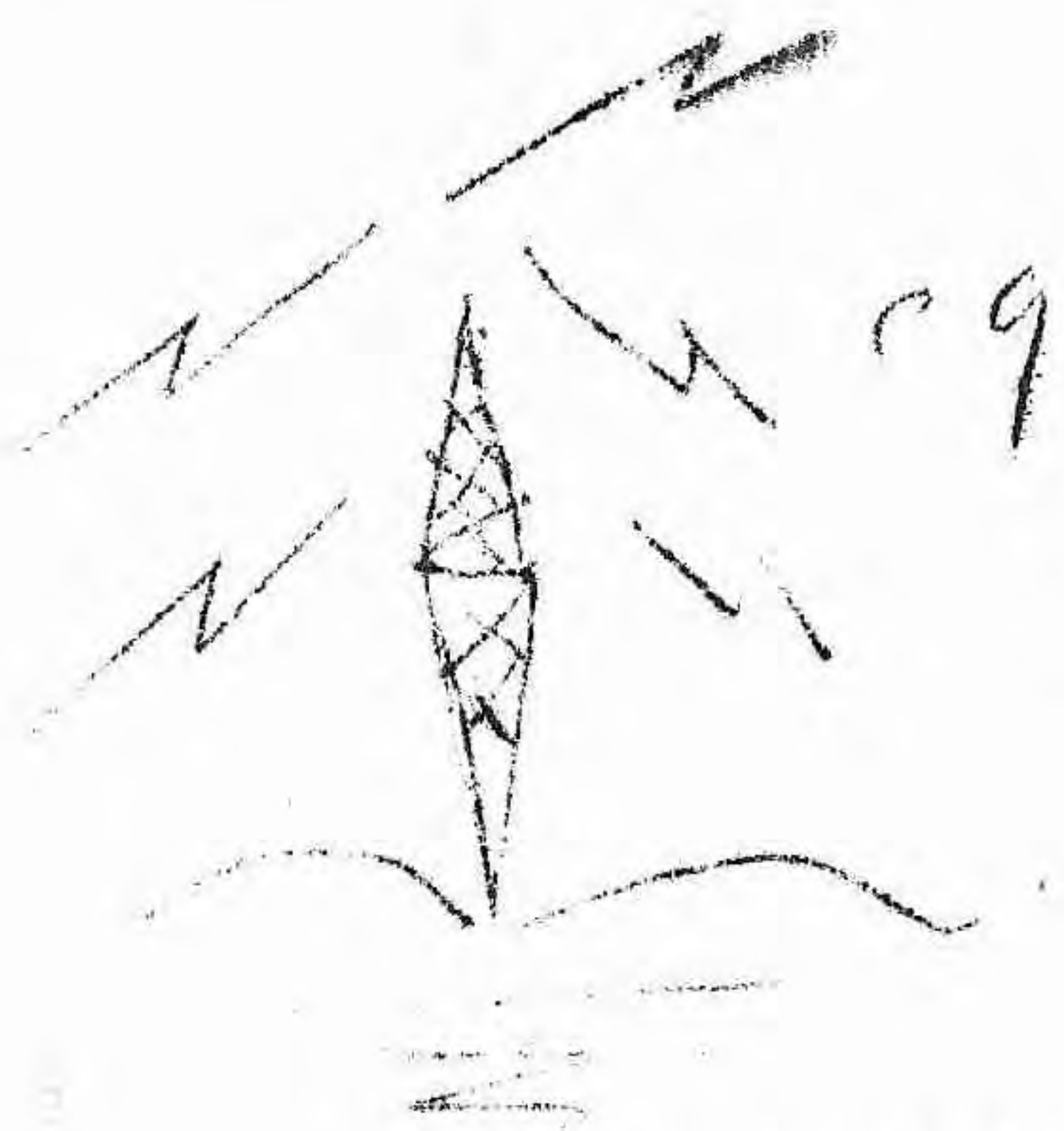
To the new members of the recently formed committee our congratulations and remember that the club are 100% behind you in all endeavours that may occur in 1948.

This being the initial issue we are anxious to know what YOU think about the clubs mag. Let us know by letter or in person at the Club meetings. To be successful we must have your co-operation

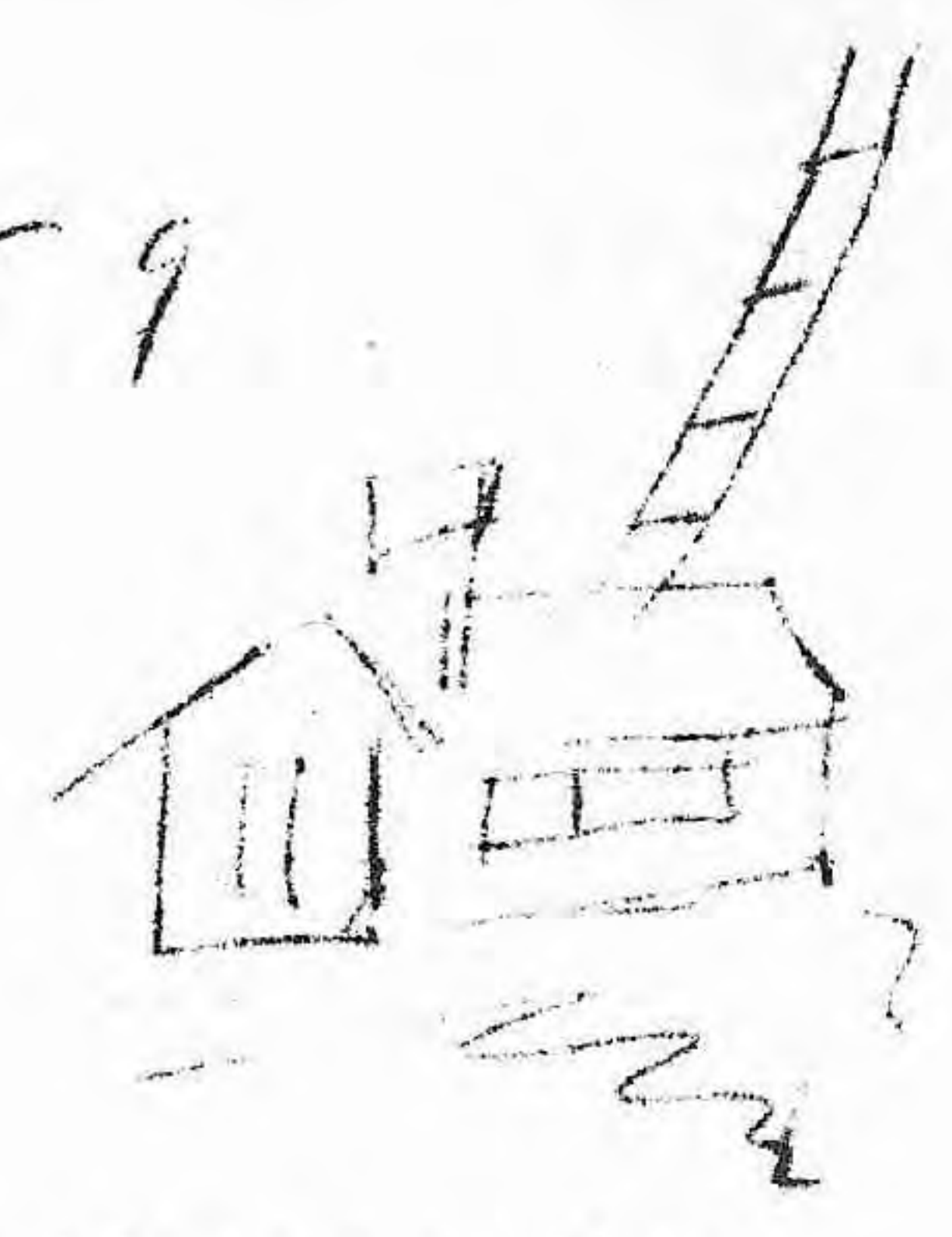
