displays and prizes for our third Annual Banquet.

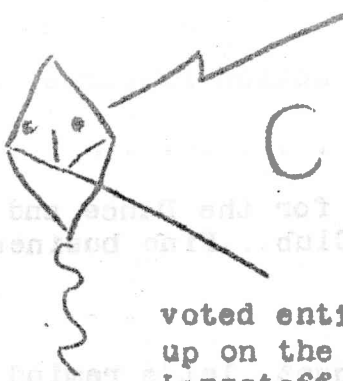
Congratulations you ten meter Hams for boosting our

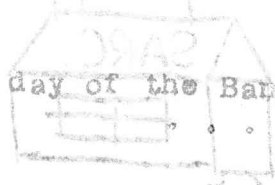
